

Roles and Responsibilities in the Netball System

The Whole of Netball (WON) Plan is based on a participant-centred approach and one integrated Netball system. In our Netball system, the role of each organisation, the delivery of the plan and each initiative and related project needs to be clear. In some cases, there will be nationally led development of programmes and initiatives, as occurred with the junior Netball programme, supported by Zones and delivered locally by Centres. In other instances, there will be locally generated initiatives aligned to priorities in the WON Plan.

Seeing Netball as one system requires roles and responsibilities to be clear for everyone, to ensure capability and the necessary resources are available in the right places. At a high level, responsibilities for the respective roles in the Netball system are summarised in the following table:
